



# Canadian Commitments

## Communities, Conservation, Livelihoods 2018



- The Canadian Wildlife Federation will create and begin implementation of a 'Communities' strategy as part of their organization's approach to conservation
- The Indigenous Circle of Experts (ICE) for the pathway to Canada Target 1 commit to ongoing efforts to support bio-cultural diversity conservation and sustainable livelihoods through the reconciliation framework of ethical space. This commitment includes forwarding Indigenous Protected and Conserved Areas (IPCA's) and "The Solutions Bundle for All" which is an inclusive innovation of "Two Eyed Seeing" that that envisions a unique role and responsibility for all Canadians in implementing the ICE report and recommendations.
- Sustainable Forestry Initiative and Learning Tree Canada commit to continuing our work to engage with indigenous and local communities, to ensure that they are a part of and that their values are considered during the forest management process

- The Canadian Parks Council will advance environmental conservation in support of sustainable livelihoods by committing to implement aligned actions through *Parks for All: An Action Plan for Canada's Parks Community*
- Parks Canada is committed to collaborating with other federal, provincial and territorial parks and protected areas agencies, Indigenous peoples, industry, and other partners in conservation to promote biodiversity and protect 17 percent of Canada's lands and inland waters in a coordinated network

# Global Commitments

Communities, Conservation, Livelihoods 2018



- Conservation International will launch a new Center for Communities and Conservation in the Fall of 2018 to engage more effectively with Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities in conservation.
- The IUCN Commission Environment, Economics and Social Policy will expand our work through a collaborative program with IUCN's Indigenous Member Organizations in support of Environmental Defenders.
- The IUCN Commission on Education and Communications will support a Natural Cultural Festival at the World Conservation Congress in France in 2020
- The IUCN World Commission on Protected Areas is committed to support and collaborate with government agencies, NGOs, indigenous partners and local communities in the effective implementation of the Government of Canada's unprecedented investment of \$1.3B for planning, creating and managing national parks, private protected areas and indigenous protected and conserved areas in Canada.

- Develop a Collaborative Research Agenda reflecting Communities, Conservation and Livelihoods
- Foster local collaboration between CCRN and IUCN Members and Commissions in key geographies
- Will launch a joint award for work on Communities, Conservation and Livelihoods at the IUCN Congress in 2020
- Launch a Learning Platform that will include outputs from the Conference and broader shared learning connecting with other networks
- Collaborate on a Stream/Component on Communities, Conservation and Livelihoods at the IUCN World Conservation Congress in 2020 in France.
