




Fig 2. Geographic distribution of coastal WEBs research











Is wellbeing disaggregated?





Type 2

 How the supply of ES affects WB (supply-demand)



E.g. Community-based MPA in Kenya ↑ ES (fish biomass), which increased incentives for poaching therefore ↓ local WB (Mahajan et al. 2016)

Type 3

 How the WB of one individual or groups affects the WB of another (demand-demand)



E.g. Urban development in coastal Spain ↑ WB of construction entrepreneurs, but ↓ WB of local residents & fishers (de Andrés et al. 2018)

Key gaps in coastal WEBs research

European bias in publications


- ☐ The majority of papers focus on a single snapshot
- ☐ Well-being often aggregated

- ✓ Well-being disaggregated (gender and livelihoods) and differences more deeply analyzed
- ✓ Closer engagement with tradeoffs, non-linearities & uncertainty in analyses
