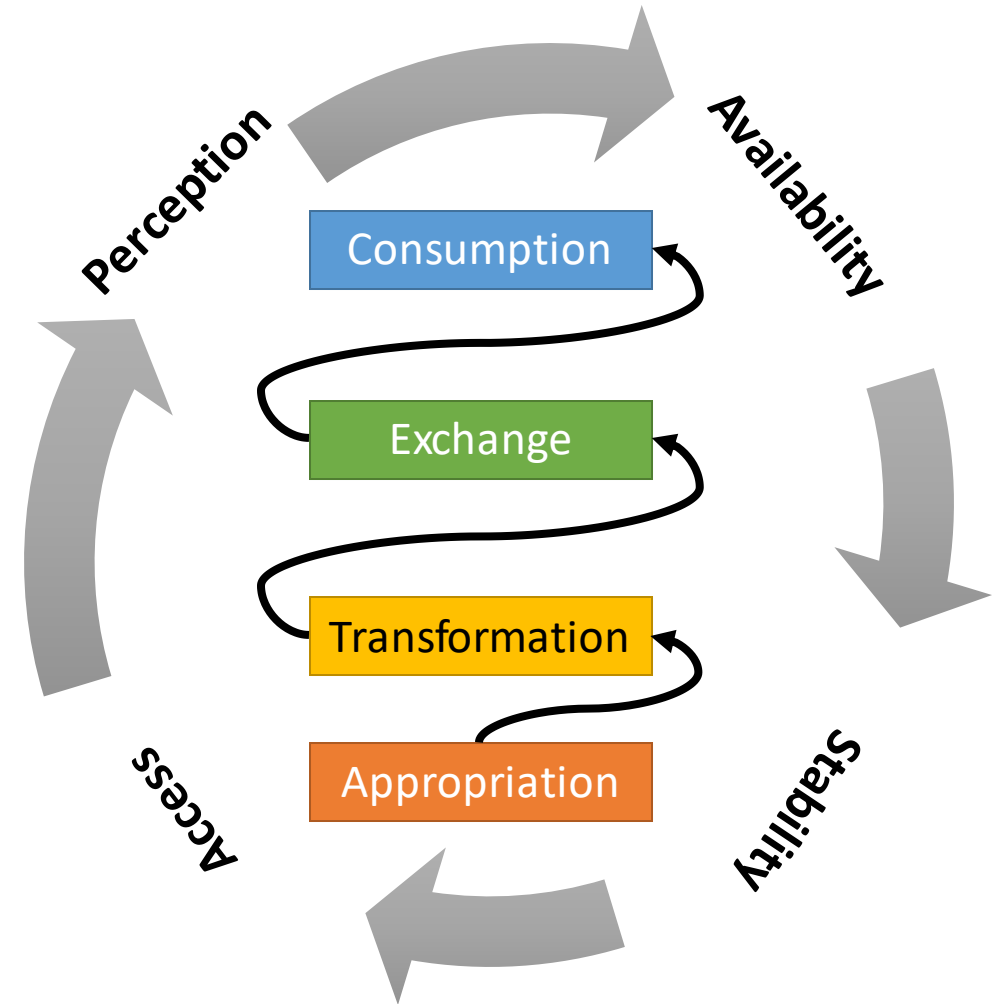
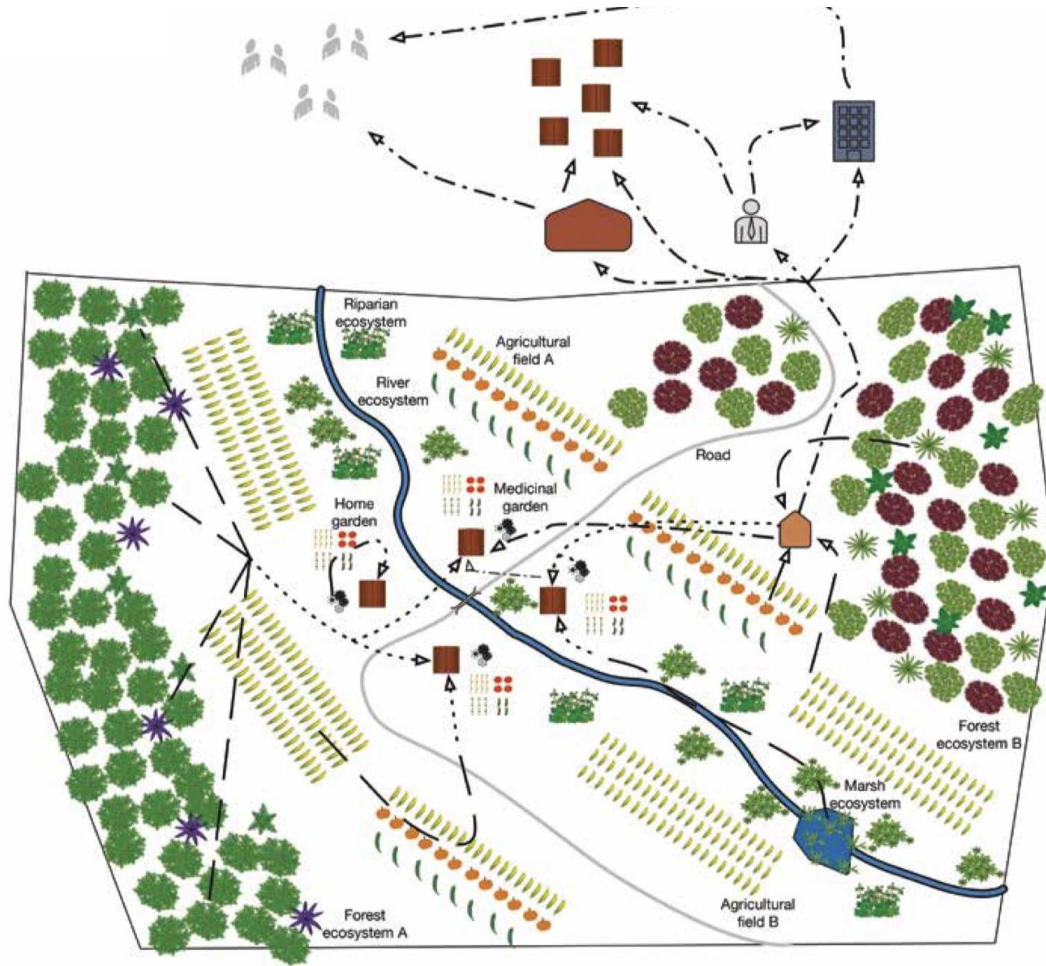

- Promotion of cultural identity and economic development

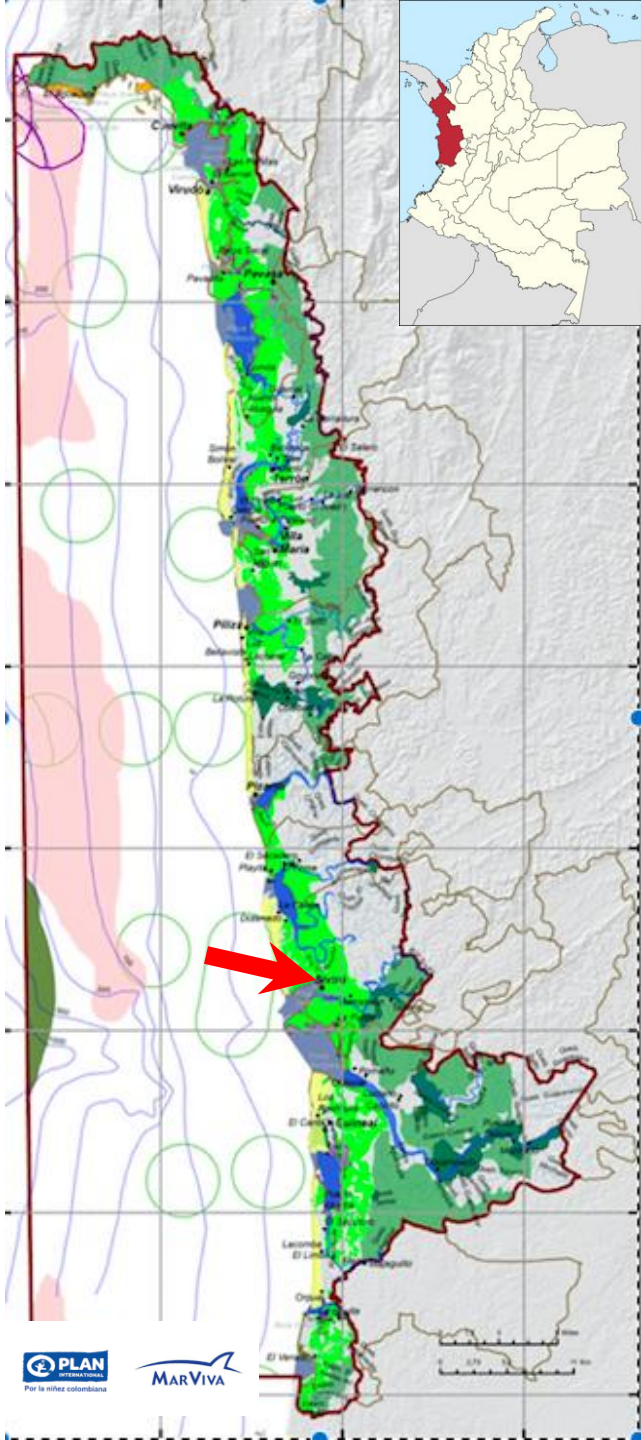
Lack of basic services: electricity, aqueduct, education

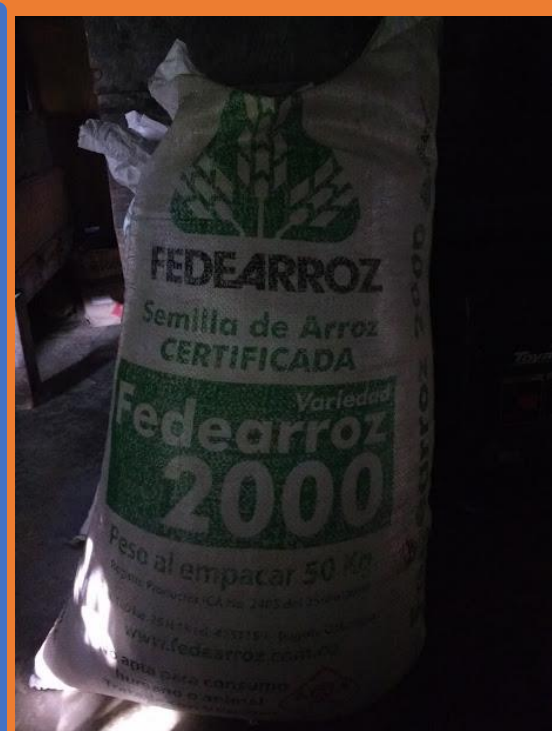
