### How did we engage with 'fish as food'?

- Embraced a collaborative, iterative, emergent process guided by participatory action research methodology
- Carried out research that was community-driven and/or responsive to community-identified needs >> lobster
- √ "Followed the energy"
- ✓ Invested adequate time and resources into relationships and decision-making
- Supported capacity-building of students and partners

### Participatory Community Food Security Assessments

What are the components of, and factors contributing to, community food security in NS?



- Community-led and implemented
- Mixed methods 8 different methods to collect information on 10 indicators in each community
- Each community also explored one unique aspect

Most comprehensive provincial report on community food security in NS, with community reports.


# Eastern Shelburne County Our Lobster, Our Communities project

- □ 15 video-interviews with lobster industry stakeholders
- Aimed tell the story of the lobster industry from those within the industry, in the rural coastal communities of Eastern Shelburne County
- □ Thematic analysis, and in-depth video storyboarding
- Collaboration/participatory process with NSCC video production and Lobster advisory committee (Acadia, MSVU, ST. FX, EAC, community members)
- □ Created 15 min video, research report & 2-page summary

### **Putting Food First in Nova Scotia**

(NSHRF KSSA Award 2015-2017)

- Aim: move Making Food Matter (2014) research on community food security to action through a series of participatory knowledge mobilization strategies targeting decision/policy-makers and knowledge users.
- Collaboration with the Depts of Health and Wellness & Agriculture and Aquaculture and Fisheries:
  - Proaction Café called at FSC 2014 conference; Briefing notes; meetings with each Minister, and follow up meetings with Directors and Policy Leads
  - Series of meetings and workshop with senior staff and community-based partners >> Working Group formed
  - □ Hosted 2 events (Mar 2016 & Jan 2017) ~80 people across province
  - Actions ongoing, Facebook page, NS Local Food Shift and Blog

### Putting Food First in Nova Scotia 2015-2016



Aim: to create a shift to more healthy, local and sustainable food in NS public institutions: e.g., March 2016 Event with Joshna Maharaj & local champions Funded by NSHRF Knowledge Sharing Support Award

### Successes & Challenges

#### **Opportunities**

- Domestic Marketing of Lobster
- Amplifying moving the knowledge to action to support social and policy change
  - e.g. establishing an incubator for people to iteratively explore, experiment, and learn about how they can propel their work on local and healthy food procurement forward.

#### Challenges

- □ Long process
- Tension between research objectives/deliverable s & time to respond to opportunities
- Tracking policy impact
- Continued funding
